


### Voter Education for citizens on CVR

#### JDPMC IN COLLABORATION WITH INEC, OSUN STATE SENSITIZED THE PUBLIC THROUGH SPONSORED RADIO PROGRAMME EPISODES AND MARKET OUTREACH IN 5 LGAS

As Continuous Voters Registration exercise is the first step and beginning of every electoral process, JDPMC identified the need to sensitize the people of Osun State on the need to participate actively in the CVR exercise which commenced on the 18th of August 2025 especially citizens who just attained the age of 18 years.

The Democracy and Good Governance Programme engaged key stakeholders, including the Osun State INEC Resident Electoral Commissioner and the State Director of the National Orientation Agency, through a sponsored radio programme. It also supported Good Governance Committees in carrying out market outreaches across 5 LGAs: **Egbedore, Odo Otin, Orolu, Ede South, and Ejigbo**

### Livestock vaccination intervention



#### JDPMC LAUNCHED VACCINATION CAMPAIGN IN PASTORALIST COMMUNITIES IN OSUN STATE

In its ongoing commitment to promoting sustainable livestock production, the Rural Development Programme of the JDPMC, Osogbo, has intensified its support to marginalized and vulnerable pastoralist communities across Osun State. The state continues to grapple with livestock diseases such as **Contagious Bovine Pleuro Pneumonia (CBPP)**, **Foot and Mouth Disease**, and **Lumpy Skin Disease**, which threaten the livelihoods of pastoralist families.



The initiative has received widespread praise from beneficiaries, many of whom testified to the sustained immunity of their cattle against CBPP since the inception of the vaccination programme several years ago. This success underscores the importance of continued veterinary outreach and health interventions in pastoralist communities.

Additionally, a Community and Security Agents Forum on peacebuilding was held in Awo and Ikirun to strengthen collaboration and foster understanding between security personnel and community members..
