JDPMC DEPLOYED STRATEGIES TO REACH THE ADOLESCENTS AND YOUNG PERSONS (AYP)

JDPMC in her effort to curb the continuous spread of HIV carried out campus and online sensitization to curb HIV among young people, trained service providers for youth-friendly care, tested about 3,000 youths, and linked around 100 to HIV services. JDPMCt also launched a mobile app called HIScan offering reliable HIV information and facility contacts across Osun State.

In this project, Social Media influencers were engaged to create content such as tweets, vox pop, event highlights and Call to Action designs. Also, X space platform to reach more adolescents and youths outside the States.

A total of 6 schools were sensitized, UNIOSUN (Osogbo Campus), OSCOTECH Esa Oke Ede Polytechnic, Iree Polytechnic, School of Health Technology Ilesa, School of Health Technology, Ejigbo. This project is sponsored by **The United States President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR)**.

In furtherance to the discuss, a recommendation for the inclusion of traditional rulers, in order to deepen dialogue and broaden community-level impact.

JDPMC PROMOTES THE USE OF LOCAL INNOVATION TO PRESERVE SEEDS AND CROPS

The 2025 Annual Stakeholders' Forum of the Rural Development Programme (RUDEP) of JDPMC was held on **4th of December 2025** with **530** participants in attendance, under the theme **"Local Seeds Conservation, Native Breeds and Organic Practices: A Necessity for Strengthening Food Security."** The forum brought together Farmers, Pastoralists, Community Leaders, Government Officials, and Development Partners to promote sustainable Agriculture, food security, and rural development.

Speakers emphasized the importance of preserving indigenous seeds and livestock breeds, reducing reliance on synthetic chemicals and genetically modified inputs, and strengthening peaceful coexistence between farmers and herders.

A key outcome of the forum was the presentation of results from farmer-led research conducted by **142 Local Innovation Ambassadors**, which confirmed that locally sourced organic solutions using plants such as neem, garlic, pepper, and Siam weed are effective, affordable, and environmentally safe alternatives to chemical inputs.
